### **Updated Lawn Policy Please Sign and Return Form**



Spring is almost here, which means it is planting season. The lawn policy has been updated. It is included on pages - . Please review this policy carefully, sign, and return it to the office no later than March 9th. We will review the policy in detail at our March tenant meeting. Please be aware of the following updates:

- Flowers must be no taller than 10 inches.
- You are not allowed to plant bushes, shrubs, or bedding plants (ground-covers and other plants that are known to spread quickly).
- You are allowed a maximum of 2 flower pots and 3 decorative items. Flowerpots cannot be counted as decorative items.
- You may have up to two patio chairs and one small patio table in front of your unit.
- You are allowed to attach small garden flags and wind chimes to the outside of the building using a non-damaging adhesive.
- You must remove dead flowers and weeds.
- Artificial flowers are decorative items and are not considered plants. We suggest using flowerpots to display these.

If you have planted daylilies or other tall flowers that come up every year, these must be removed. Kevin is willing to move these to a common area for you.
