Lawn Issues And Reminders

Improvements

We appreciate your patience.

Lawn Policy Reminders

We appreciate your cooperation with the lawn policy. Your plants and décor add value and beauty to the property.

We would like to remind you of the following policies, which you may have forgotten: From the house rules:

- 1. Tenant is not allowed to store household items, gardening items, or anything else outside, including mops, extra flower pots, potting soil, etc. The sidewalks must be kept clear at all times. This includes shoes and cups/water bottles.
- 2. Tenant is not allowed to interfere with any lawn maintenance personnel or vendors. Questions and concerns about the maintenance of the lawn should be directed to the site manager.

We will have to start issuing warning notices for violations of these rules. We appreciate your cooperation.

Parking Issues Policies And Courtesies

Our parking lot has a limited



number of parking spaces. We do not assign parking places. Parking is first-come, first-served.

We have two handicap spaces, one at each end of the property. We are not able to specifically assign these spaces, or add additional spaces. Handicap spaces are also available on a first-come, first-served basis, for those with a handicap decal.

Tensions have been rising lately about the parking. Please refrain from aggressive behavior in response to parking issues. No one should insist on a particular spot. We recommend each tenant park on the side of the parking lot that corresponds with where you live.


Complaint Handling Responding Appropriately

They are helping maintain the value and livability of the property, for the benefit of all residents.

♥♥♥♥♥♥ Peggy's Chicken & Rice From the *Recipes for Life Cookbook*, Tabernacle of God Church, Published by Morris Press

Ingredients

- 1 c washed rice
- 1 can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 can cream of celery soup
- 1 can cream of chicken soup
- 5-6 chicken breasts, uncooked
- 1/3 c melted butter

Instructions

- 1. Mix the 3 undiluted soups together
- 2. Pour half the mixture into bottom of chicken casserole
- 3. Place raw, wet rice over this, and cover with remaining soup
- 4. Place the chicken breasts on top.
- 5. Add salt and pepper and paprika to taste.
- 6. Pour over this 1/3 c of melted butter
- Cover and bake for 2 hours in a 325 degree oven OR bake 45 minutes and set in over 2 hours without opening the door.




Many of these general shopping tips are well-known, but easily forgotten. And perhaps you will find one or two you did not know about.


- S Always ask for a senior discount. Many places offer them but do not advertise it.
